
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What is C.I.S.?

- 5. A chance to give back to peers and community


HOW DOES CIS REACH THOSE 5 BASICS? THE 6 CIS COMPONENTS:




Some services include:

- Home Visits (As Needed or Requested)
 - more of a face to face contact, not a home inspection visit
- Clothes Closet (Limited)
- Referrals to social service agencies for assistance in counseling, shelter, food, utility assistance, etc.
- Homework Help
 - Homework Check
 - Quiet Workspace
 - General Tutoring (if available)
- Parent Meetings (once a month)
- School Supplies (Limited)

CIS GOALS WITH WEST OSO

- Establish and maintain strong professional relationships with faculty, staff, and students to improve the student's chance of success
- Increase parental involvement throughout the school year
- Monitoring student behavior, academics and attendance so that they don't fall behind



When can a student come to CIS?

A student is allowed to come to CIS office during the following times:

- Emotional/Family Crisis
- During elective classes (with <u>Teacher Permission</u>)
- Passing Period
- After School
- At Lunch
- When teacher feels student could benefit from completing classwork independently



Policy for Voluntary Participation in CIS

It is the policy of Communities In Schools of the Coastal Bend that each student chooses to participate in the CIS program.

Exceptions to this policy include:
Disciplinary Strategies (As agreed upon by CIS and the school district) and court mandated participation.




Do the "Write" Thing

- ❖ Ambassador will be able to meet with national leaders and their papers will be published and placed in the Library of Congress




